Wine growing has been practised here for many centuries and is still all-present in Krems. Worth visiting is the historic centre, the Kunstmeile Krems, the museumkrems at the Dominikanerkirche and the Gozzoburg. The abbey in its present form was built from 1702 to 1736 according to plans by J. Prandtauer and J. Munggenast and represents Austrian Baroque at its most magnificent: the imperial staircase, the imperial apartments, the marble hall, the library and the abbey church.
